WHOEVER COMES TO ME WILL NEVER HUNGER'

Sometimes what we eat really seems to matter. We don't want a certain food because we had the same thing yesterday or maybe we don't like the taste. At other times, we crave a particular food. We feel nothing else can satisfy us.

What I love are those times when I get to share a meal with someone, and it doesn't matter what we eat. Like dinner with my wife on our wedding anniversary when the two of us can simply be together. Or when an old friend comes to town and the meal gives us a chance to talk. In these cases, the food is not nearly as important as the person.

Jesus showed he understood our physical need to eat. He fed the five thousand. The Lord's Prayer includes a petition for our Father to give us our daily bread. But Jesus also challenges us to work for food that endures. He wants to be certain we also receive from his Father the true bread from heaven which gives life to the world. Ultimately, Jesus wants us to believe in him and come to him through the Eucharist - when the food and the person are one.
