<u>'EPHPHATHA - THAT IS, 'BE OPENED!'</u>

The English translation of this Aramaic word is used in the Rite of Baptism (for children) and as part of the preparatory rites used with the elect on Holy Saturday. In this rite we are invited to open our ears and our mouth 'that you may profess the faith you hear to the praise and glory of God.'

We are called to be evangelisers! We are called to allow God's Word to live in us, then to live and act in ways that will allow its message to spread to others.

I am conscious of so many people, famous and not so famous, who have worked to bring the healing and reconciling values of Jesus to the many communities they were a part of in this world. Often this occurred at great cost to themselves. People like Anglican Bishop Desmond Tutu of South Africa and Sr. Dorothy Stang, a U. S. missionary in Brizil. Yet there is still so much to do. More effort is needed.

Today's Gospel reminds us of our baptismal call to open *our* ears, *our* minds, *our* hearts, to hear the need in our own communities and to respond.

'What is it that needs to be 'opened' in me to allow me to touch the hearts of those many people thirsting for intimacy and community?'
