SUMMER STORMS!

The sycamore tree came crashing down during a modest storm which struck on the first day of June. The fact that it fell at the start of Summer surprised many people. After all, it had withstood the storms of Winter which usually are far more severe.

But the reason for its sudden collapse was not too deeply hidden. In Winter the tree was bare. The wind whistled through its empty branches, unable to get a proper hold on it. But in Summer it was a different matter. Now the tree was clothed with an abundance of large leaves. Hence, the wind was able to get a firm grip on it and wrestled it out of the ground.

Trees are more vulnerable before **Summer Storms** because they are loaded with leaves. People too have more to fear from 'Summer' storms than from 'Winter' storms. By Summer Storms I mean ones that come when things are good. And the rich have more to fear than when the storm hits the poor. The poor seem to have more resilience, and of course have less to lose. This may account for the fact that when apartheid was still the system of government in South Africa, suicides were three times higher among whites than among blacks.
