## 'HE COMMANDS EVEN THE UNCLEAN SPIRITS AND THEY OBEY HIM'

Clearly, Jesus knew his own people well and loved them. Yet, from the very beginning of his public ministry, Jesus seems to have dealt with a tough crowd! Whether in the streets or the synagogue, he willingly faced a mixed and conflicted audience. Some open and others hostile, many were divided as cliques for all kinds of political and religious reasons, and most were likely to be (then as today) personally wounded, conflicted and searching for salvation.

But for whoever truly listened to Jesus, he was far more than a persuasive and compassionate teacher. His own actions mirrored his words and gave him authority.

Most strikingly, Mark's Gospel states that those most wounded and particularly those enslaved by evil could immediately recognise Jesus for who he was. At this moment early on in Jesus' ministry even the possessing demons found the clarity to respond to his commands in obedience. But what of all the others in the crowd?

As one of Christ's people today, am I listening to him? How will I give him authority today ... over me, over my life?
