'We seek to become a more welcoming community where God's message of faith, hope and love is experienced'

ALL ENFOLDING.

Today's Gospel reading has (John 10:11 - 18) has Jesus saying something rather intriguing: 'I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold; I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd; (v 16). Two things here are surprising.

First, Jesus claims ownership over other 'sheep' without saying who they are, or whether they know they are his. Are these Jews or Gentiles? Is this claim valid today? If it is, whom does it include: those of other religions, those of none?

Second, the sequence of events is surprising: 'I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice' (when I do so?) You would expect that they listen first, and then follow. But no! Jesus leads; the listening follows.

How should we view the Church's mission in the light of this understanding of what Jesus says? Well, it means that wherever mission goes God is there already. There is no such thing as a 'Godless' people, or a 'God-forsaken' place. We have to acknowledge that in God's sight, if not in ours, 'others' are in the fold. They may not know this, but we should. Consequently, basic to mission is the task of making people aware o Jesus bringing them into the fold.

Then follows mission's second task; enabling those in the fold, newcomers and those of long-standing alike, to listen to Jesus' voice through hearing his word. Consequently, familiarity with his word on the part of those on mission is essential. Otherwise, whose voice will they be listening to?

NOTICE TO CONSUMERS OF KILLASSER GROUP WATER SCHEME: Consumers of Killasser Group Water Scheme are advised that following a number of meetings discussing water quality issues and the introduction of new regulations governing the quality of water supplied by all water suppliers to do domestic consumers, the group has decided to commence chlorine treatment of all water supplied by Killasser Group Water Scheme in the immediate future. This treatment is necessary in order to comply with drinking water quality regulations and to eliminate the problem of intermittent coliform contamination of supply which the group has experienced for many years now. The group scheme has purchased the equipment necessary to treat the water and will begin commissioning it on a phased basis over the coming weeks. Consumers are advised that this work will be carried out by a specialist water treatment company which will provide the training necessary to operate the system safely as well as devising a quality control and testing system to ensure safe operation of the system, consumer safety and compliance with drinking water safety standards. This work may take a number of weeks co complete and consumers are advised to **continue boiling all water for human consumption until further notice.** Should any consumer have concerns or queries over this issue they are invited to contact Martin Noone (Chairperson) of the scheme at 087-2233225 to discuss them. <u>CONCERT</u> FOR CALLOW CHURCH? An open Meeting will be held on Monday Night next 4th May at 8.00 p.m. to discuss the possibility of having another fund-raising Concert in Callow Church. This matter was discussed at the recent Parish Pastoral Council meeting. Everyone who is interested in being involved in promoting such a concert is invited to attend.

CHANGING TIMES IN PARISH LIFE: An article in Friday 17th April edition of the Irish Independent concerning our neighbouring Diocese of Tuam made interesting reading. In a few years time most parishes in the diocese will have only one priest, the exceptions being the larger town like Castlebar, Tuam and Westport who will have more than one resident priest but less than they have at the moment. To maintain services, as a diocese they are clustering parishes like we are doing in Achonry. The Bishop also speaks about ordaining Male Deacons. This is still a very male dominated and clerical type of church. Obviously the involvement of women at this level needs to be looked at as well. Equally important is the willingness of so many unordained people, male and female, to be involved in the life of the church if it is to continue to be at the centre of parish and family life. At present Tuam Diocese has 100 priests in active ministry, 40 years ago they had 170 priests and in 4 years time they will have only 70 priests in active ministry. That is the picture in Tuam but something similar is happening in our own Diocese and we are probably more advanced in some aspects. Clustering has been happening for longer in Achonry. Also, over half of the Parishes in Achonry have only one resident priest and more will probably follow in the not too distant future. It is now six years since the last ordination in the Diocese, there is just one student studying for the diocese. If he continues it will be another couple of years before he is ordained, which means there will have been a gap of almost ten years. This has to have implications, along with retirement of priests and possible illness. All this means everything cannot stay as it was ten, twenty or thirty years ago. We do not like to hear this, we resist any form of change but we cannot ignore reality indefinitely. We have to use our personnel - Priests and all involved in the various ministries within parishes - to the best advantage. We also have to think more of gathering people together in terms of Masses celebrated and all the other Liturgical Celebrations/Paraliturgies. Half empty churches or less than that are not conducive to good celebration. It can be soul-destroying. It is important to understand that you can have an excellent celebration with 10 people and a lifeless celebration with 100 people. So much depends on how and where people gather or scatter. All this will continue to be discussed at Pastoral Council and Cluster level. All this may be a scenario we prefer not to hear about but one we cannot avoid unless we bury our heads in the sand! Comments are always very much appreciated.
