THE MASTER'S VOICE.

Most of us if we were to choose between losing the ability to hear or see, would probably find the idea of losing sight unthinkable.

Yet, strangely the most important prayer of Judaism recited at morning and evening prayer by them, and repeated in our First Reading and Gospel today - the 'Shema' tells us 'Hear O Israel, the Lord our God is one.' It teaches that hearing not seeing is what counts. But why is this? Why is hearing thought of as more important?

Possibly because, in an image conscious world, that if you try to make an impression that is precisely the impression you give. Seeing can lead to idolatry, the false Gods of designer labels, making the 'right' connections beckon in the world of sight. Hearing however leads to obedience. No physical shape or form distracts the worshippers. There is a purity about hearing. Hearing can mean deep understanding and coming face to face with... people who love you, your parents, friends and God. You obey the Voice who commands you. Hearing is literally believing.

Maybe it's because while He asks us to listen to his Voice, he expects us to see His word made flesh in each other in how we live and treat each other and our very selves.
