### GETTING IT RIGHT.

A sense of urgency in many lives today, with many minds sitting in church racing ahead to what tasks are for accomplishing over the weekend. We flit and fly around the place, but rarely stop and wonder.

In a real sense this 21<sup>st</sup> Century sense of hurriedness is mirrored in the readings echoing over 21 centuries of human experience. Paul and Barnabas cover impressive amounts of territory (First Reading). If they had our modern modes of transport available to them, we can only wonder how much more might they have achieved. Jesus picks up on this with words like 'now' 'very soon.' Why - because he won't physically 'be with you much longer.' Which should make us stop in our tracks without production line planning of the day. Suppose this was my last day - are my current preoccupations really that worthy? Probable not. We're told that the mutual love of all Christians is the greatest sign of the presence of the Risen One. What inheritance are we leaving behind to those who follow us? One hymn puts it, 'They Will Know We Are Christians By Our Love.' In our case, we can only wonder - would they really?
