THE ANNUAL CANCER-ACTION MHAIGH-EO SPONSORED CYCLE has been deferred this year and will now take place at the end of October. At the moment there are Metal Cans, Plastic Bottles, Cardboard and General Domestic Waste. Presumably it is just a fraction of a per cent of people of the Parish who act so selfishly, lazily and thoughtlessly - it is doubtful if anybody travels a great distance to do this, and if they do their activity is even more despicable. If you are responsible for this mess of garbage, if you would consider keeping our village from being a rubbish tip, then pick up some courage and take it back. If you do not, you are simply highlighting your cowardice.

TROCAIRE - SOUTH ASIA AND PERU EARTHQUAKES: Recently Trocaire, the Catholic Development Agency, has responded to a number of serious floods in parts of South Asia and the recent earthquakes in Peru. Hundreds of people have died and millions have been affected by the severe flooding that struck India, Pakistan and Bangladesh recently as well. Trocaire is providing assistance through its local Church partners on the ground and has pledged $\in 230,000$ tohelp supply food, hygiene kits, kitchen utensils, clothes and bedding to thousands of families. They will later receive seeds of livestock to help them recover their earnings. In Peru, two earthquakes killed over 500 people and injured more than 1,500. More than 100,000 people were left homeless by the disaster, as more than 34,000 homes were destroyed. Survivors are facing a lack of food and health and sanitation problems. Trocaire is working with CEAS, the Catholic Bishops Conference in Peru, and Caritas Peru, to coordinate a humanitarian response.
