BAPTISM - A WIDER VIEW.

Our Christmas ends with the baptism of Jesus. A solitary figure stands in the river and hears, as the heavens were 'torn apart', the voice, 'You are my Son, the Beloved'. There will be other moments. Mark's Gospel continues typically. The breathless narrative, like a mountain river, leaps from rock to rock, intense, urgent, matter-of-fact, surging ahead as if everything depended on it - which it did.

Which makes it all the more important that we have a still point with which to weigh all other experiences. Baptism can be such a time. It is important to us. Any church has always placed a great emphasis on the act of baptism.

In a world of collapsing boundaries, we still all too easily define ourselves too narrowly. We are loyal to country, members of a family. Baptism reminds us that we are not just citizens of one country, members of one religion, members of one family, and members of one race and gender. We are citizens of the whole world, one with all who believe, brothers and sisters with the human family.

Baptism trumps any other kind of membership, especially the mega-bucks private club membership. Our real passport is not issued by an individual country and baptism put us into solidarity with others far beyond any one faith or denomination. We are citizens of the world before any national citizenship. Baptism reminds us of that.

His funeral took place in Swinford on Thursday last 29th. December. May he rest in peace.

PREPARATION FOR AND CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AT PARISH AND CLUSTER LEVEL: As you are probably aware, many parishes have been and are offering a preparation/information evening for Parents and Godparents prior to the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism. At present our Parish Pastoral Council are discussing the merits of this approach for the future as a means of keeping the flame of faith more alive. While saying that better preparation could lead to better celebration of the sacrament, in the light of a very informative workshop/seminar that members of the council attended recently, they are not saying that what happened in the past was faulty. However in a different faith context/climate, we can no longer take for granted in 2006 many of the things we did take for granted in the past. Within this context it is hoped to encourage some people in the parish and within each parish in the cluster to become involved in this very important ministry. This will involve some training/education for the participants who might consider becoming part of such a ministry team. Their role would mean working with the priest(s) in preparing the Parents and Godparents of the Children to be baptised for the celebration of the Sacrament and they could also be involved in the actual celebration. It is the Parish Community, not the Priest who welcomes the Child/Person into the worshipping community, so it is only appropriate that some of the community be present. It is not the role of anyone, Priest, Baptism Ministry Team, Parish Community, Grandparents or other family to force the Parents of any Child to have him/her baptised. It is the Parents of a child who needs to ask to have their child baptised. Then every assistance, information, preparation is made available for the best celebration possible. Due to the size of our Parish and the number of candidates for baptism each year, those involved in Baptism Ministry will not be too overworked. You are encouraged to consider becoming involved. It is important for parents of children for baptism in the future to try and see this approach as a help to a better understanding of the richness of the Sacrament which is so full of meaning and symbol. This can so easily be overlooked, which is a great loss. A different approach is not meant to be burdensome or to create barriers in peoples' way. It is something that we as a worshipping/parish community need to think about a lot, to absorb into our minds and heart and this takes time! If you wish to become involved you might fill in the reply slip at the bottom of this page and give it to any member of the Parish Pastoral Council or place it in a box that will be provided in each Church. You might consider doing this over the next two weeks - it would be nice to have a list of volunteers by the end of January.
