#### HE SAW AND BELIEVED:

What did the disciple believe when he saw the burial cloths rolled up and put aside, and there was no body to be found? It would be logical to think something dastardly had occurred. Could his body have been stolen? Was this one last sign of disrespect for the man from Galilee who offered his life?

Only those who had wandered the roads with Jesus as he ministered could possible have suspected that the appearance of grave robbery could mean something altogether different. Perhaps as word spread, even those who had been touched by his words or his actions would begin to open their imaginations to the unthinkable - he was no longer in the grave because he was risen from the dead.

The followers of Jesus brought physical sight to the tomb, but more importantly, they brought insight with them that was the result of being shaped in the presence of Jesus. Faith can indeed be rooted in physical realities - there was an empty tomb - but it must make the leap where our physical senses can only point with wonder. This leap is one that trusts in God's surprises.

NOTICE TO CONSUMERS OF KILLASSER GROUP WATER SCHEME: Consumers of Killasser Group Water Scheme are advised that following a number of meetings discussing water quality issues and the introduction of new regulations governing the quality of water supplied by all water suppliers to do domestic consumers, the group has decided to commence chlorine treatment of all water supplied by Killasser Group Water Scheme in the immediate future. This treatment is necessary in order to comply with drinking water quality regulations and to eliminate the problem of intermittent coliform contamination of supply which the group has experienced for many years now. The group scheme has purchased the equipment necessary to treat the water and will begin commissioning it on a phased basis over the coming weeks. Consumers are advised that this work will be carried out by a specialist water treatment company which will provide the training necessary to operate the system safely as well as devising a quality control and testing system to ensure safe operation of the system, consumer safety and compliance with drinking water safety standards. This work may take a number of weeks co complete and consumers are advised to continue boiling all water for human consumption until further notice. Should any consumer have concerns or queries over this issue they are invited to contact Martin Noone (Chairperson) of the scheme at 087-2233225 to discuss them.
