Being upset, disappointed, jealous, angry or lonely. Feeling a lack of confidence, or a lack of something can make us greedy, possessive, even lustlful. We live in a culture of success, where everything is built on the idea of ascent, with everything on the rise be they prices or expectation. It's a world where you fix and control. In that culture ironically most of the learning is done in the darker emotions. After the age of 30 everything worth learning comes from the experience of failure, disappointment, humiliation, lonliness and loss. At such times, we would do well to pray to the Holy Spirit; 'Peace I leave with you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you.' It will keep us calm and at peace.
