HE SPOKE TO THEM IN PARABLES.

I consider myself blessed to have lived in an Ireland where the land was valued. My father and many other farmers went off in spring-time with horse and plough to plant seeds. I can still see the rich brown soil, obedient to the sharp blades of the plough, as the furrows were turned over. The field had to be harrowed, stones picked and the soil refined. No effort was left undone to prepare the ground for the falling seed.

The parable of the Sower would be quite intelligible to a rural population to which many of the listeners of Jesus belonged. Our growing urban population depend to a large extent on supermarkets for their food. Instead of planting seeds we tend to or, have tended to, build houses and replace soil with cement and tarmac.

What images would Jesus use today to explain about the Kingdom, God's dream for His people? Undoubtedly he would radically question systems which are dehumanising and sacrafice almost everything to economic growth. People live in apartments, in too close a proximity for comfort. They spend a lot of time commuting and waiting in traffic. The obstacles to the growth of the Kingdom are different but no less real. Can we identify them and name them? Can I enter into conversation with my neighbours about what is causing the pressure? There are choices that we can make together if we take the trouble to reflect, slow down and be less in control of a Universe never ceasing to evolve. We need to welcome the Spirit of God creating cracks in a dehumanising system. 'Let anyone with ears, listen' Such is Jesus' admonition, in a Gospel ever old and ever new. Let us remain open to a process leading us to a greater happiness and freedom.
