A KILLASSER/CALLOW PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL SPECIAL MEETING took place on Wednesday 28th November in Callow Church. A first draft of the analysis of the Parish Questionaire Responses is now complete and this was looked at in detail at this meeting to make some adjustments that were necessary. The full meeting was devoted to this purpose apart from a few other minor details.

THE ANALYSIS OF THE PARISH QUESTIONAIRE will be made available to everyone who wishes to see it. It will be available at the Church Doors at all the Masses next weekend 22nd / 23rd December. After publication of it, the next

step is to try and see what we can implement as a parish community to enrich our faith journey. That is a bigger challenge, but I am confident that we can take it on together and move forward step by step. It is very clear from it already that the majority of people who responded wish to have the Vigil Mass for Christmas at 12 Midnight as it has been for many years. It will be at Midnight again this year. There is also agreement to have a two-hour gap between the starting times of the Masses in Callow and Killasser on Christmas Day and Easter Sunday to allow sufficient time for the celebrant to travel from one to the other with a little less pressure of time. Mass this year on Christmas Day in Callow Church will be at 9.30 a.m. and in Killasser Church at 11.30 a.m.

PARISH QUESTIONAIRE - PEOPLE AVAILABLE TO BECOME INVOLVED IN MINISTRY: This was a very encouraging aspect of the questionnaire, to know that quite a number of people indicated their willingness to become involved in the various ministries in the Church. As the questionnaires were not signed, the Pastoral Council would appreciate very much if those people who wish to become involved would contact any member of the Pastoral Council. New people are always needed and are most welcome.

A CLUSTER STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING was held in the Fr. Peyton Centre Attymass on Thursday night 22nd November. The possibility of having a group of people to work with the priests in the cluster in preparing Parents and Godparents better for the Baptism of their children was discussed again. This will, hopefully, enable them to become involved in this ministry. We now have two volunteers and we would still like to have one more. Do think about it.
