'We seek to become a more welcoming community where God's message of faith, hope and love is experienced'

'THIS I COMMAND YOU: LOVE ONE ANOTHER.'

All of God's revelation boils down to three little words found in 1 John 4:8, 'God is love.' As Christians, what should be our response to that simple summary of the faith? Jesus answers that question for us in today's Gospel in equally simple words, 'Love one another as I love you.' While his words are few, their implications for us are enormous.

This type of love calls us to action and not necessarily with the warm, fuzzy sentiments commonly associated with romantic and familial love. It is a love that is self-sacrificing service to others. We might consider this too difficult, assuming we're no modern-day saint. But we can find examples of this kind of love in the ordinary human existence we all share. The parents who work an extra shift so their teen can go to the concert. The homemaker who volunteers to help out in the community. The coworker who shares lunch when ours was forgotten. The retiree who passes the golf course to visit with an elderly neighbour instead

This is how we lay down our life for others., by making routine daily services. In doing so, we bring the love that is God to all those around us.

'When have I experienced the benefit of someone else's service on my behalf? Did I recognise God in that experience?

ACCORD PRE-MARRIAGE COURSES - CHARLESTOWN CENTRE: In 2008 they delivered 10 Courses to 149 Couples and a 'mini course' to Couples. There were 20 Couples on some Courses. In 2009 they are reducing to 9 Courses because of fewer facilitators. It is highly recommended and encouraged that every couple would do a Pre-Marriage at least 9 months before the wedding date. At certain times there can be a waiting list of 2 to 3 Months which, when couples delay in booking, can result in them taking their course too close to their wedding date.
