THE DIVINITY CODE.

It's been a good year for lovers of theological conspiracy theories with Dan Brown's 'Da Vinci Code.' But every Advent, there is another hidden puzzle that escapes notice, right under people's noses.

They're called the 'O' Antiphons which are prayed every Advent from about the 7th Century onwards. They form an increasingly urgent plea from a weary world for its redeemer to come. Each day from 17th to 23rd December, beginning with the letter O, we have various titles for the coming of Jesus. O Wisdom, Lord, Root of Jesse, Key of David, rising Sun, King, Emmanuel.

In the original Latin, if you read the initial letter of each title backward (Sapientia, Adonai, Radix, Clavis, Oriens, Rex, and Emmanuel), you get EROCRAS. It literally means an enigmatic 'I will be tomorrow.'

But, why tomorrow? Why not today? Why the wait? Sometimes we only understand things when we look backwards. Life is lived forward, but understood backwards. We may only know the full meaning when a prophecy is fulfilled and we look back. It's the same with our life. In God's holy flirtation with the worldl, we don't fully understand things. Advent has us looking forward to a coming, but it seems that it will be afterwards, when we will fully grasp the rhyme and reason for things.

MASS ON CHRISTMAS NIGHT IN KILLASSER AT MIDNIGHT OR AT AN EARLIER TIME? A number of people have asked does it have to be at 12 Midnight or could it be celebrated a little earlier to suit children and older people. Nothing is set in stone and change is always possible. As a result of putting the question to the congregations last weekend and listening to the responses - those who gave their views to the Pastoral Council Members all wanted the Christmas Night Mass to be celebrated at 12 Midnight again this year - those who gave their views to Fr. O'Mahony - 3 wanted it to stay at 12 Midnight and 15-20 wanted it to change to an earlier time like 9 or 10 p.m. It is important that the Parish Pastoral Council would hear and take into account all views on both sides of the debate. The Pastoral Council does not decide what should happen, in isolation, but but only after reflecting on the views and wishes of the people of the Parish, in so far as it is possible to get those views. It will always try to represent the wishes of the majority of the people. As a body it must always be open to the possibility of change. The feeling at the meeting last Wednesday night was that more people wanted Mass at 12 Midnight than at an earlier time. It was also felt that enough time wasn't given to decide to change this year. The Pastoral Council has been discussing the possibility of a parish questionnaire for the past number of months. It now seems more relevant than ever - what do we really want at Christmas and Easter as regards Church Ceremonies/Services? Another issue that needs to be discussed is the timetable of Masses on Christmas Morning - 10 a.m. Mass in Callow and 11.30 a.m. Mass in Killasser are too close together for the one Celebrant. How about Callow at 9.30 a.m. or Killasser at 12 Noon? We certainly seem to have one very real and relevant question for a Questionnaire.

<u>CHRISTMAS EVE IS SUNDAY THIS YEAR:</u> At our last two Parish Pastoral Council Meetings the Mass times/schedule for Christmas were discussed. It was suggested that we could have two vigil Masses on Saturday 23rd December - 7.00 p.m. in Callow and 8.00 p.m. in Killasser - and leave Christmas Eve Morning free. This has now been accepted unanimously as a result of putting to the congregations of last weekend..It will now be easier to focus on the Christmas Vigil Mass.

KILLASSER COMMUNITY ALERT COMMITTEE has been sanctioned for a Grant of €5,840 for extra security equipment. This will be given by the Department of Community and Rural Affairs. It is expected very shortly.

<u>KILLASSER NATIONAL SCHOOL CHRISTMAS CONCERT</u> will take place in the School on Tuesday next 19th December. As usual it will be a night of great entertainment.

<u>CARRAMORE NATIONAL SCHOOL CHRISTMAS CONCERT</u> will be on next Thursday 21st December. Great entertainment promised and a night not to be missed. Both concerts will commence at 7.30 p.m.

The chicks have provided and extra source of food and income for the whole community and this has made life easier for all 200 people who live in the village.
