In Ireland we call it cuteness, seeing the angle, feathering the nest, greasing our way around something. Cuteness is not lovely in itself and while it shows a lack of scruples, it is ingenious.

Why do we do it? Well, as the economy fluctuates, one thing will always remain constant - our preoccupation with money.

THE ANNUAL CANCER-ACTION MHAIGH-EO SPONSORED CYCLE has been deferred this year and will now take place at the end of October.
