REACHING OUT.

We have all had the experience of feeling welcome. It feels like being cared for, secure, like you're at home, that you belong and are accepted completely. In response you can feel gratitude and awe that strangers would be kind to me.

In total contrast, the feeling of being unwelcome 'we're busy right now' makes you feel humiliated, small, hidden away. It is a lonely, isolating and frightening place. As community life is increasingly privatised, and the house becomes a trophy that defines its owners status, the second experience is more likely to be the norm. Which is a shame of course. As we will all find ourselves in some way sitting by the road like Baritmaeus. We will learn that we are inter-dependent, not independent.

So many of us in this anxious, depressed culture that we live in are saying the thing as Baritmaeus. We want to see, to glimpse things in a new way. Few want to live in a society that does not notice them, yet we stick with the familiar. To Bartimaeus and us, the advice is still good. (a) Have courage. (b) Get up and (c) follow.

A blind man who viewed the world from his limited viewpoint, risked, rose and followed. He may not have had sight, but he had insight. Do we?
