A SURPRISING GOD.

It's not often that a man fleeing from a murder rap sees God. But that is exactly what happened with Moses. A fugitive after slaying one of Pharaoh's overseers who was abusing Hebrew slaves.

But this was a different Moses, different to the man who had spent half his life learning leadership skills from the ruling empire of the day. He had spent a further 40 years learning wilderness survival skills. A perfect combination. In the desert he learned to know the voice of God, a God of the present tense 'I am.' And yet, his palace upbringing surely gained him a foot in the door with Pharaoh. God can work even our past to good, no matter how unpromising material it may seem.

He still walks into lions' dens, fiery furnaces, weddings, funerals, broken homes, hospital rooms, bankrupt businesses and jail cells saying 'I am - always with you.' Moses teaches us that you don't run from your past - you learn from it and that no experience is ever wasted. You will always learn something.

Yes, everyday the press will report murders, accidents, front-page catastrophies. Jesus himself reported two news item of the day, not to scare, but to warn of complacency. Everyone runs the risk of being hardened to the urgency of conversion. You could even be like the tree he cites - not giving a fig. But God is a patient gardener. All thing and experiences turn to good.

<u>FIRST HOLY COMMUNION SUNDAY THIS YEAR</u> will be on Sunday 6th. May. The Children of Second Class in Carramore and Killasser National Schools will receive Holy Communion for the first time at the 11.30 a.m. Mass on that day. This year 12 children will receive Holy Communion for the first time.

<u>FIRST CONFESSIONS/PENNANCE</u> celebration was planned for Killasser Church on Thursday 29^{th} March at 7.00 p.m. This needs to be changed on account of Leaving Certificate Graduation Mass planned for that date. Five families are involved. The new date is Wednesday 28^{th} March at the same time. Hopefully this is suitable for all concerned.

<u>THE NEW SEATING FOR CALLOW CHURCH</u> was delivered on Monday 29th January. The new furniture definitely enhances the appearance of the church a great deal and highlights the excellent work that has already been carried out. Sincere thanks to those who have already made donations towards the cost of the new furniture - five in number and to a number of others who have indicated they are willing to make a donation. The amount of each donation is \in 1,000. The total cost of the furniture is \in 38483.52c. The conventional seat/benches in the main body of the Church will accommodate a minimum of 82 people. There are also 80 Chairs which will obviously seat 80 people. The chairs are placed in the choir area, baptismal area, the gallery and area inside the side door of the Church. Chairs are moveable and as a result give one the freedom to use the areas where they are for a variety of purposes. The chairs are connected to each other but can also be arranged in different formations. With traditional seating, one is very restricted in what one can do, because it cannot be moved around. This is a pity, because with buildings (churches) that so much money is spent on, it is a pity that they have not more flexibility for a variety of uses. Callow Church now has that advantage.

<u>SINCERE THANKS</u> to the 9 families who have contributed a $\leq 1,000$ each toward the Callow Church seating. The total cost of the seating is just over $\leq 38,000$, so further donations will be very gratefully accepted. Your generosity and support is always very much appreciated.

KILLASSER/CALLOW PARISH RENOVATION FUND ENVELOPES will be distributed to every home in the parish over the next couple of weeks. The Parish Finance Committee, as has been announced some time ago, is asking each family to contribute \notin 500 towards the recent renovations on Callow Church, Killasser Parish House and further work that will always be necessary at both churches and the Parish House.
