UP-FRONT SHEPHERD.

Part of the Prayer of an Unknown Confederate Soldier goes like this: *I asked for strength that I might achieve / I was made weak that I might learn humbly to obey / I asked for power that I might have the praise of people / I was given weakness that I might feel the need for God.*

That soldier got more than he bargained for. So do we. He ends his prayer with gratitude to God; *Almost despite myself my unspoken prayers were answered / I am, among all people, most richly blessed. Thus should we end ours.*

Today's first reading reminds me of that prayer. *It is you who will be shepherd of my people Israel*, you who shall be ruler over Israel (2 Samuel 5 : 2. This applies to David, newly anointed King. His model - a ridiculous one to all power-conscious bosses - is the shepherd. This type of leadership is gentle and caring. It provides safety. It creates peace. It knows the need for vigilance. Shepherds, lowly and illiterate men, are up-front with their flocks.

Leaders at any level have a lot to learn from this image - even though those they 'lead' may not in any way be sheepish.
