Feile Na nGael Report by Billy Love



Kilkenny hosted the 2007 Feile Na nGael "It was last hosted by Kilkenny 27 years earlier in 1990" and it turned out be the biggest gathering of under 14 handballers ever to come together for feile. A total of 51 teams entered. 30 teams in boy's 40x20. 14 teams in girls 40x20 and a disappointing 7 teams entered in 60x30 this was a bit disappointing as 60x30 is so strong in Kilkenny. Making it a total of 255 young handballer's taking part. The weekend started off with the skills competition. This part of the feile

commenced in O'Loughlin's. All the skills entrants were paraded down through the packed balcony and on to the court floor to the song The Eye of the Tiger theme tune from the Rocky films this went down a treat with players and the audience. . Mrs Brigid Burke did the introductions on the night as Gailge. The format for judging the skills was changed this year. It was decided to have three people judging the skills instead of the usual one, as this was thought to be fairer. Before the skills commenced our National Anthem was played by Windgaps musicians Claire Comerford, John and Eoin Ryan, and was sung by Julie Walsh, Mary Phelan from Clogh read the Feile pledge. After the skills Competition all the handballer's marched behind the national handball banner and their own club banners to Nolan Park. The handballer's were paraded from the grounds to the music of St Patrick's brass band from Cashel Co. Tipperary. Great crowds of people gathered on the footpaths to cheer on all the young people. The parade travelled down Hebron road, on to Johns St. As the last handballer's passed over John's bridge the first were heading up Patrick's St. this will give an idea of the size of the handball contingent. Great cheering continued as all the players were introduced to the crowd of on lookers by the great Michael O'Murochu. All the Captains were presented with Feile Pendants. The parade finished in the Grounds of St Kieran's College.

On Saturday morning the games commenced. 11 venues were used Talbot's Inch was used for the 60x30 competition while Kell's Clogh, O'Loughlin's, Goresbridge, Muckalee, Windgap, Monavea, and Garryhill were used for 40x20. Great praise must go to the clubs and their helpers who hosted the games. There was great praise from all the people who travelled for the way they were looked after with food and refreshments Kell's of Kilkenny were holders of 40x20 Division 1 and a great effort by them gave them back to back wins. They beat Mallow 42-34 to retain the Simon Cleary Perpetual Cup. Clogh reached the Division 1 girls final but lost to Ballydesmond of Cork.

Kilkenny winners in the skills competition were Fergal Lawlor (Talbots Inch) in Boys 60x30 Division 1. Brian Mahon (Clogh), won the Boys 40x20 Division 4 and Marie Walsh Kell's, won the Division 3 Girls.

11 Kilkenny teams entered the competition. Kilane, Mullinavat, Talbot's Inch. in 60x30. In 40x20 Clogh entered in Girls Division 1 & Boys Division 4, Kell's in Boys Divisions 1 & 4 and Girls Division 2, Windgap in Girls Division 2 & Boys Division 3 and O'Loughlin's in Boys Division 3.

Without some one at the helm this would not have been possible. A working a committee comprising of Seamus Reade, Billy Love, Martin Lawlor Betty Funchion, John Ryan under the leadership of county secretary Liam Mahon.

Adult Report by Martin Lalor



Players of the Year: Eddie Bourke and Michael Clifford (O'Loughlins). Playing together for the first time this season they improved with every match, culminating in them winning the 60 x 30 Intermediate Doubles crown when defeating Tipperary's Paul Mullins and Adrian Johnson, 21-8, 21-8. Coming through Leinster when defeating Wexford in two sets, they

accounted for Galway in the semi final and then saved the best for last when comfortably winning the final against the Munster pair.

Certainty of the Year: With Ducksie Walsh in the Masters grade, there was never any doubt who was going to win the titles on offer. Partnered by Pat Maher of Clogh, the Kilkenny duo eased to both the 40 x 20 and 60 x 30 titles, defeating Cork 21-6, 21-10 in the former and Tipperary 21-2, 21-4 in the latter, while in Masters A Singles, Ducksie received a walkover in the 40 x 20 final and had a facile 21-1, 21-2 win over Willie O'Dwyer (Tipperary) in the 60 x 30 decider. Ducksie did relinquish one Masters title during the year when he was beaten in the Masters Hardball final, a code of handball that he has very little experience in playing.

Most Improved Player of the Year: Ciaran Neary (Talbots Inch). Having won his first All Ireland medal in 2006, Ciarán really stepped up this season when reaching three All Ireland Minor finals. Although unsuccessful in all three, against Limerick opposition, the young Talbots Inch player improved greatly during the year and will no doubt learn from these experiences.

Surprise of the year: Johnny Brennan (Mothel) and Joe Hennessy (O'Loughlins). When these two former Kilkenny hurlers teamed up this year, few would have predicted they would end up All Ireland champions in 40 x 20 Golden Masters (A) Doubles. After winning in Leinster, they produced a thrilling 21-20 third set victory over Kevin Geraghty and Martin Cronin in their home court in the semi final and then accounted for Cork's Pat Morris and Chris Hurley, 21-10, 21-13 in the final at O'Loughlins.

Masters Players of the Year: Paddy Reilly (O'Loughlins) / Seamus Reade (Talbots Inch) These veteran Handballers lost the 40 x 20 Diamond Masters Doubles final to Clare'e John Kirby and Jimmy Walsh. 21-12, 21-14. However later in the year they won the 60 x 30 title in the same grade. In the decider they comfortably saw off the challenge of Cavan's Greg Sheridan and Patsy Hand,

Senior Display of 2007: Michael Ducksie Walsh.

The Talbots Inch star cmae out all guns blazing in this year's 60 x 30 championship. Reaching the final after a top class display when defeating Michael Gregan (Wicklow) in the semi final, he found the class of Eoin Kennedy (Dublin) too much on the day, losing 21-10, 21-6. A fantastic achievement for a player in his second season in the Masters grade, and a true indication of a great athlete.

Juvenile Performances of the Year : In a year short on All Ireland success, Chris Dawson (O'Loughlins) captured two U 17 titles. In the 60 x 30 Singles final he defeated Waterford's

Tom Hanrahan, 21-5, 21-3. Earlier in the season he partnered Dylan Clifford to victory in 40 x 20 U17 Doubles when beating Cork 20-21, 21-14, 11-6.
